JEROME H. ALCIATORE was born in New Orleans, LA. He graduated from Tulane University with a Bachelor of Architecture degree and, while at Tulane, received the Alpha Rho Chi medal for leadership service and merit. Later he attended the Harvard Graduate School of Design in special programs of continuing education. He is NCARB certified and is licensed in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Alabama.

After his Army service as an engineer unit commander, he began his architectural career with a large New Orleans firm. He later became the senior associate in another organization before becoming one of four partners in a Metairie, LA firm. He founded his own architectural and planning firm in 1983.

Alciatore joined CSI in 1968 as a member of the New Orleans Chapter and served in all offices until becoming Chapter President in 1976 and 1977. He holds the distinction of winning competition awards in both design and specifications preparation. He received the New Orleans Chapter's "Albert C. Bear Memorial Award" in 1978. He also held executive offices in the New Orleans AIA Chapter.

He served as CSI Gulf States Region Director from 1987 to 1990, after which he served two years as Institute Vice-President and became the Institute President in 1994.

He continues his CSI service as part of faculty in the Institute's Certification training programs in the New Orleans area.
