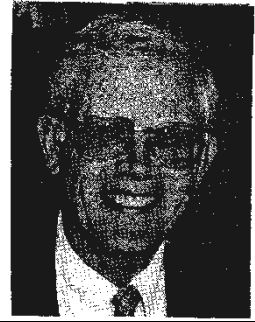


ROBERT E. ARMITAGE, FCSI

ROBERT E. ARMITAGE was born in South Portland, Maine, in 1932.

His education in architecture at Syracuse University was interrupted for US Army, where he served from 1953 through 1955. After being honorably discharged, he returned to school, and received a Bachelor of Arts in Architecture from Syracuse University in 1958.

Robert returned to Maine to work with his father, architect William O. Armitage. This led to a partnership in 1966 and to forming a corporation in 1968 as William O. and Robert E. Armitage, Architects. He also formed his own company, Architectural Interior Systems.

He was Chair of the Maine Board of Licensure for Architects, Landscape Architects and Interior Designers, and represented the state on the New England Council of Architectural Registration Boards and the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

"Post-World War II Residential Architecture in Maine - A Guide for Surveyors" mentions work done by Robert and his father.

Robert was a leader in the systems approach to school design and construction, and he designed the first domed gymnasium in Maine. He also designed the state of Maine pavilion at Expo 67 in Montreal, Canada.

He is a registered architect in Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Massachusetts and holds an NCARB certificate.

Robert attended the 1966 Institute Convention at Boston where he met Arthur Brown, then CSI's Region 1 Director. This led to founding the Maine Chapter of CSI in March, 1967.

Armitage passed away 14 March 2014.
