LOREN R. BERRY was born in Eugene, Oregon in 1956 and grew up around the campus of the University of Oregon. He worked as a roofer and carpenter before, and while, attending the local Community College. He married his wife Lynda in 1977 and continued to work his way through school as a carpenter while attending the U of O School of Architecture. Loren graduated with a Bachelor of Architecture in 1984 carrying the school banner, with his wife and three young children in attendance.

Loren's career was in Eugene, working as an architectural intern for a few local firms and passing the Architectural Registration Exams in 1987. He started his own architectural practice later that year, mostly working for the local hospital and medical groups, either as an Owner's representative or as designer and specifier. His father, Jack, moved back to Eugene and they formed a partnership in 1991, which became

Berry Architects, PC soon after. Loren is currently licensed in Oregon, Idaho and Arizona and holds a NCARB certificate.

Loren joined the Willamette Valley Chapter in 1992 after attending his first meeting and has been active in Chapter committees and leadership ever since. He was the Chapter President in 1999-2000 and newsletter editor from 2004 through 2006.

Loren formed the Student Group Affiliate at the University of Oregon in 2001 and continues to work with the students and faculty there. He also formed the State of Jefferson Group Affiliate in southern Oregon and the High Desert Group Affiliate in Central Oregon in 2009. For these efforts he received the Region's most prestigious award, the Frank Stanton Memorial Award.
