


Jorgen Graugaard, FCSI

JORGEN GRAUGAARD was born in Copenhagen, Denmark. He earned a BFA in 1953 and a BA in 1955 and then immediately was drafted into the Royal Danish Army. He served in the Signal Corps from 1955 to 1957 and from 1957 to 1960 at the Military Mission of the Royal Danish Embassy in Washington, D.C. He attended Columbia Technical Institute in Washington, D.C. and earned a diploma in Architectural Technology in 1961.

After his military discharge in 1960 he worked for three years for Chloethiel Woodard Smith in her DC office of Satterlee & Smith Architects and then for Chloethiel Woodard Smith & Associates for another seven years, for Saunders, Cheng & Appleton in Alexandria, VA for ten years and five years for the Marriott Corporation as Director of Documentation.

In January 1985 he opened his own practice as a construction specifications and materials technology consultant. Over the years, he has been preparing construction documentation and worked in the area of contract administration, materials technology and research for both government and private clients for a wide variety of projects nationwide, in Saudi Arabia and Europe.

Mr. Graugaard's diversified project involvement include chanceries for the Embassies of Egypt, Finland, Greece, The Netherlands, Saudi Arabia, a mosque and two Greek orthodox churches, large scale public building renovation and historic preservation projects, numerous office building complexes, law enforcement building types, medical facilities, hotels, restaurants, performing arts center complexes, community centers, a multi-function sports complex and two Washington/Metro train stations and garage facilities.

His many activities with the DC Metro Chapter included Director, Chairman of various committees and President for two years of the then fourth largest Chapter in the Institute. He instituted the Chapter's highest award in memory of the third Institute president, Carl J. Ebert, initiated the presentation of 10 and 20-year chevrons and inaugurated the Chapter's first highly successful Product Show. In 1992 Mr. Graugaard became a charter member of the Northern Virginia Chapter and he has served that new Chapter as Director, Historian, and Chair of the Awards and Nominating Committees.
