RAYMOND R. RIEGER was born in Wyandotte, Michigan in 1927. He attended Henry Ford Trade and Apprentice School and graduated as a Tool and Die Maker. In 1946 he entered the u.S. Army and was assigned to the Corps of Engineers. Among his various duties he taught Topographic Drafting. He was discharged in 1947 but was recalled in 1950 and served overseas until 1952.

While in the service he married and after he arrived home, Rieger decided to change directions in his career. While working full time as a draftsman he studied at night school to earn a degree in architecture. However, in 1957 an opportunity arose and he was offered a position as an Architectural Sale Representative. In 1967 he was made President of the company.

In 1964, Rieger joined CSI and served on various committees. In 1973 he was elected to the Chapter Board and from 1975-1976, he served as Treasurer and Vice President.

From 1984-1988 he served as Chapter Vice President, President Elect and President.

Rieger was active at the Regional and Institute levels. He served as Institute Treasurer from 1981 to 1984 and received his Fellowship in 1983. He was the Institute Vice President in 1986.

Rieger received the Robert P. Brosseau award in 1988 and two Institute President plaques in 1982 and 1983.

In addition to CSI, Rieger was also on the Board and Chairman of The Construction Association of Michigan from 1989 to 1992. He is a Professional Affiliate with the Michigan Society of Architects.

Rieger remains active in CSI and the construction industry and is President of HMG, Inc., which represents quality construction products.
