JAN SANDERS is a native of Mississippi and served two years as deputy in the Mississippi Chancery Court System. She moved to Memphis, Tennessee in 1960, accepting a position as assistant comptroller with a national electronics and custom kitchen distributor. In 1963, she became part of a structural engineering firm's management team, and first encountered CSI while upgrading their information retrieval and construction documentation systems.

In 1966, Jan moved to the Little Rock, Arkansas area, and, with her husband, Jerry Sanders, established Sanders & Sanders, Inc., an architectural consulting firm. She resigned from the firm in 1975, when her partner/husband left to become Arkansas' first State Architect. Jan established the State's only Environmental Graphic Design firm in 1980, and has provided business imagery and consultation in environmental graphics for many of Arkansas' most prestigious projects.

Sanders joined the Little Rock CSI Chapter in 1983, firmly establishing herself as both a leader and a follower. Equally comfortable in a mentoring, or learning role, Jan has served behind the scenes as a supporter, and up front as the instructor. In 1989, she joined other construction industry leaders in helping organize the Arkansas Construction Industry Council. Sanders is the 1996 recipient of the Albert R.
