

# E. Ernest Waymon\*, FCSI

E. ERNEST WAYMON was born in Memphis, Tennessee in 1920. After high school he was employed by a local architect. Three years later he started work for E. L. DuPont de Nemours, Construction Division in Memphis, then Morgantown, West Virginia and Terre Haute, Indiana after which he entered the cadet program of the Air Corps.

During his time in service he served as pilot of a B 24 bomber and flew missions over Germany until shot down and taken prisoner. He was a prisoner of war until liberated in May 1945. After the war, he served in the Air Force Reserve, attaining the rank of major before retiring.

After discharge Waymon returned to DuPont Design Division in Wilmington, Delaware. Having completed a correspondence course, he passed the exam for architect and

worked for a local architect until starting his own office. Twenty five years later he retired.

In 1967 Waymon joined the Philadelphia Chapter of CSI. The next year he served as treasurer and the following year as vice president elect. To eliminate the commute to Philadelphia he co-founded the Delaware Chapter and served as its first president. He was Chairman of Region Conferences in 1974 and 1981. Waymon served on the Jury of Fellows in 1977 to 1979, and became Region Director of the Middle Atlantic Region for 1978 - 1981. During this period he chartered two new chapters and was a member of the Ad Hoc Committee for development and construction of the CSI office building.

Waymon passed away 21 November 2009, in Arvada, Colorado.
